Happy Bee



Happy Bee is a Parent-Child Programme designed for children aged from 4 to 6 studying in K2 or K3. The programme consists of two major parts, including Lower Kindergarten and Upper-Kindergarten, with eight units for each level. Children will be rewarded with a sticker each on the Handbook after the completion of each unit.

-Training Objectives

To provide children with social understanding and knowledge of health matters. This enables them to have a better understanding of the society, and also to train them in developing good habits and to become independent.

To help children develop motor skills and coordination, together with enhancing their inter-personal skills.

To arouse the children's interest in participation of activities. Through these activities, children learn to become more cheerful, outgoing, courageous and obedient. They also have the opportunity to learn problem-solving skills.

Mode of activities

- The programme consists of interesting games and activities, which correlate with the kindergarten curriculum.
